# New Manager at The Bookmark

Julian Segal, the new manager at The Bookmark, has been involved with independent bookstores and publishing for much of his career, having held positions with Shakespeare and Co. (Berkeley), Hey-Day Books (Berkeley), and Red Wheel/Wiser/Conari (San Francisco and Massachusetts).

Since assuming the manager's position at The Bookmark Julian has hit the ground running and has spent a great deal of his time increasing the bookstore's online presence. He currently has 600 titles online and hopes to increase that number to 1,000 by the end of the year.

He'd also like to encourage more walk-in business; continue to have a table at the local farmer's market and perhaps at other farmer's markets; return to participating in 1st Friday's with live music, art, and readings; build the bookstore's collection of LPs, DVDs, and CDs; and possibly start a Sunday book club

Volunteers are an integral part of the bookstore and Julian says



he can always use more, especially on weekends and the late afternoon shift — 2:30 to 5:30 p.m. Currently, the bookstore picks up twenty to thirty boxes a week from donors. Julian would like to start an "on-call" group of volunteers that would be dedicated to making these weekly pick-ups. They wouldn't have a regular shift but would still receive the volunteer discount. If interested in volunteering at the bookstore in any capacity, please contact Julian at 510-444-0473.

When asked how he views the future of publishing and bookstores given the amount of digitizing taking place, Julian said he thinks, in the future, textbooks will be digitized but there will always be a place for bookstores and books, especially books as art and that there will be a new emphasis on the use of fine papers, unique fonts, and special bindings, and more boutique micro publishers will be in the market-place.

Julian is at The Bookmark Sunday through Thursday. Stop by and say hello and perhaps volunteer!

# An Interview with Tamra Hege, FOPL Board Member

Tamra is a 3rd generation Californian, born and raised in Concord where she lived 2 miles from town. Because her mother worked, in the 7th and 8th grade she walked from school to the small Carnegie Library in the town's central plaza. Her mother told the librarian she could read any book in the library. Her favorite books told of expeditions to the Arctic and Antarctica and she also liked historical fiction from the adult section. She has been a library supporter ever since.

Tamra attended Mt. Diablo High School in Concord where her senior English teacher had also taught her mother. She attended UC Berkeley on one of the first state scholarships and majored in zoology with a physical science minor. She lived all 4 years at Epworth Hall where she was a hasher, which covered her room and board. In college, Tamra spent most of her campus time in the library in LSB, now called the Valley Life Science Building. She was active in women's intramural sports and was initiated into the Women's C Society as a sophomore.

Upon graduation, Tamra married John Hege, who was attending UCSF and preparing for a career in medicine. She worked as a tissue technician at UCSF and later was hired to teach high school science at Hamlin's School for Girls on Broadway in San Francisco.

After graduation from UCSF, internship at Highland, 2 years in the navy at Hunters Point and a



residency at Ft. Miley, John went into private practice in Oakland, as an internist with rheumatology as a subspeciality.

Tamra retired from teaching in 1967. Son John was born in 1967 and was one of four Oakland police officers killed in March 2009. Laura arrived in 1969, is married with two sons and lives in Hays, Kansas. Anne was born in 1976, is married with one daughter and is the artistic director of Voci.

Tamra has been an active community volunteer. She was an original (1969) Natural Sciences docent at the Oakland Museum of California, was president of both the Piedmont and the Bay Area League of Women Voters, member and president of the Piedmont School Board and Planning Commission and the President of the Oakland Museum Women's Board in their 50th year.


She has been involved with the Oakland Public Library as a member of the Oakland Public Library Association and the Oakland Public Library Foundation. Both organizations were ultimately folded

into the Friends. Tamra also is on the Council of Friends of the Bancroft Library at UC Berkeley. She is a strong advocate for the library contract between Oakland and Piedmont. An article in the FOPL newsletter prompted Tamra's inquiry and current service on the board.

#### Coffee Table Cookbooks

So far I've found six different Culinaria Cookbooks (The Caribbean, France, Greece, Italy, Spain, and European Specialties) at The Bookmark, on different occasions. # Summer Reading Fun for All Ages

"Paws to Read" is the 2014 theme for the Summer Reading Program. The Summer Reading Program encourages children to maintain their reading abilities after school is out. Numerous studies have shown that children who select books for themselves and read for fun will improve reading comprehension, vocabulary, spelling, and writing skills.

The main library and all branches of the Oakland Public Library will participate, from June 14 through August 9. All locations will feature live entertainment and fun activities. Prizes will be given to all children who reach reading goals. Prizes include books, tickets to fun and educational attractions, and raffle drawings for movie tickets, ferry rides and boat rentals. There is also a grand prize.

Children participating in the Summer Reading Program may read anything they want, pursuing subjects and themes of their own interest and developing a love of reading. Pre-readers can participate by having someone read to them. This year, readers will be asked to keep track of the days they read, rather than the number of hours.

In conjunction with the Summer Reading Program, many library locations will also offer free lunches for children and teens, through a partnership with the City of Oakland Human Services Department and the Alameda County Community Food Bank.

Summer Reading isn't just for children. Teens are encouraged to participate in the Teen Passport Program and adults can join the fun by participating in the Adult Summer Reading Program.
