Oakland Libraries Are Back!

Great news: The Oakland Public Library (OPL) expanded service at all 18 locations as of Tuesday, June 15, 2021 to reflect the hours that were in effect prior to the COVID-19 pandemic that forced buildings to close in March 2020.

The Main Library (125 14th St) is now open seven days a week; 15 neighborhood branches will be open six days per week and until 8:00 p.m. two nights per week.

In addition, the African American Museum and Library at Oakland (AAMLO) and Oakland History Center (OHC) will be available for in-person visits and browsing. AAMLO will continue to require appointments for the archives, seed lending library, and group tours of the museum and the facility.

The 81st Ave Branch will add back its Sunday hours in the coming months.

All patrons will be expected to follow County health orders, and service will be adjusted as necessary to accommodate. All patrons and staff will continue to wear face coverings in OPL branches.

Get to Know Your Grants

In spring 2012, Oakland Public Library (OPL) teamed up with a host of community partners to offer the first-ever Oakland Youth Poet Laureate program. Now in its tenth year, this program is an unprecedented citywide effort to celebrate literacy through poetry and to connect young writers to far-reaching opportunities. Each year, OPL's Teen Services Department accepts submissions from talented Oakland writers (ages 13-18) to be considered for the honor.

More than a competition, this program creates a community of young poets. The Oakland Youth Poet Laureate and Finalists serve as ambassadors for literacy, arts, and youth expression with ongoing opportunities for performances, projects, and peer support. The Laureate also receives a \$5,000 educational scholarship provided by the Friends of the Oakland Public Library.

Myra Estrada, going into her junior year at Oakland High School, was named 2021 Oakland Youth Poet Laureate on June 4, during a live event on Facebook. You can watch the event recording -- which includes performances by each of this year's seven finalists and by past laureates -- at www.facebook.com/YouthPoetLaureate.

Ms. Estrada says, "Being named Oakland Youth Poet Laureate gives me hope for my future and my generation. With my title I'll strive to advocate for amplified youth voices and youth demands and wishes for the betterment of Oakland."


CRYING IN H MART Michelle Zauner
